Lumpkins, son of Dr. and Mrs. M. L. Lumpkins of this city, was solemnized Wednesday morning, July eighth, at ten-thirty o'clock at the Sacred Heart Church. The Rev. Robert A. Wiley, pastor of the church, officiated in the presence of a large guest company.

Preceding the reading of the marriage vows a program of nuptial music was given by Miss Josephine Gunselman, organist, and Miss Angela Reuerlein, vocalist, the latter singing Schubert's "Ave Maria."

The altar was banked with ferns, and white baskets filled with white gladioli and lillies intermittently spaced with candelabra formed the background for the ceremony.

The bride, who was given in marriage by her father, wore a gown of white silk marquisette posed over taffeta and fashioned with a shirred bodice and long full sleeves; the full skirt, shirred at the bodice, was floor length and her waist-length veil of bridal illusion was fastened to a lace crown halo. Her only ornament was a string of pearls. The bride's lovely coloring was accentuated by a bridal shower bouquet of pink rose buds, baby breath and ferns tied with pink satin ribbon.

Mrs. Lawrence Feldhaus, sister of the bride, was matron of honor, wearing a floor length dress of powder blue chiffon over taffeta, trimmed with bands of lace. She carried a shower bouquet of cream roses.

The junior bridesmaids, Nell Jean Holthouse and Kathleen Lumpkins, sisters of the bride and groom, respectively, wore identical models of pastel organdy, the former green, the latter yellow. They carried leghorn hats fashioned into baskets with long organdy ribbons for handles. These were filled with a variety of miniature pink flowers.
